

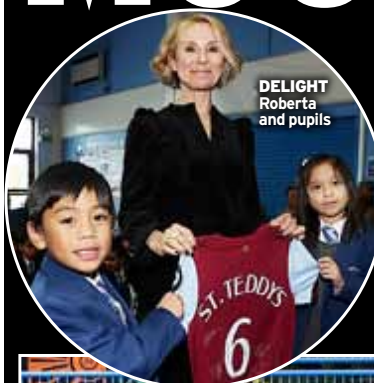

HERE'S a touch of class by Mirror legend Kent Gavin...

Our former photographer poses with Sir Bobby Moore's daughter Roberta and some ex-schoolmates who were in one of the most iconic pictures in the paper's history.

It comes 51 years after Gavin took a snap of the England World Cup winner visiting St Edward's

Sir Bobby's 100 caps picture re-created by Mirror's Kent

Catholic Primary in West Ham, East London, in 1973 to mark his 100th international appearance.

Bobby sat with 99 pupils all wearing England caps.

And Gavin also joined today's pupils to mirror the shot. Martin

Greenfield and Phil Towers, both 57, were in the 1973 picture aged seven, taken in the shadow of West Ham's old Boleyn Ground. Martin said:

"I just remember how excited everyone was." Phil added: "All of us have a copy of that photo."

Gavin said: "It was one of my most favourite photos. It was pretty chaotic at the time."

Roberta added: "Dad would have been honoured he was being remembered 51 years on."

Sir Bobby died in 1993 of cancer, at 51.
